# Here is the proposed list of student responsibilities in this course from Mr. Ancharski (with Mr. Velasco's support):

#### 1. Student Resident Expert

1. Having taken the class already, Molly would act as the second point of contact for students with questions about APUSH (the first being each other). As a fellow teen/student, Molly would be an unintimidating student liaison for the students. She could answer questions about the schedule, content, or study questions. Molly would also be responsible for making potential study guides for students to use, coming up with big picture questions that might help students focus their studying.

#### 2. Lesson Planning

 At the end of the year, Molly would create her own presentation/lesson about a second semester topic of her choosing. This would be approved by Adam/I, but the intent is to practice public speaking and research into AP US History.

#### 3. Modernization

1. A bigger goal of Adam and I is modernizing APUSH, having been fairly stagnant since the wonderful pair of Stuart and Hosmer. Part of this modernization

would be evaluating effectiveness/format of our presentations/slides. Molly would make necessary edits to clean up those presentations for the purpose of student clarity. Additionally, Adam and I would have Molly find new potential historians for us to use for future years, moving away from older, whiter historians. She would summarize the arguments, main pieces of evidence, and identify the proper historiographical school they belong to.

#### 4. Work As Needed

1. Molly would also assist in some everyday classroom activities, handing out assignments/materials. This should not be the primary focus of Molly's time as a Senior Student Aide, but it would help.
