# Frequently asked questions regarding admissions to University High School

# 1. How do you calculate the 50 points needed for admission?

Points are based on the CogAT test score and grade point average of core classes:

We do not round up GPAs; they must reach the minimum value for each point level.

## 2. How do you calculate the GPA?

We use all classes within the core subject areas (English, math, science, and social studies) for the second semester of 7<sup>th</sup> grade and the first semester of 8<sup>th</sup> grade. If a student takes multiple science classes, for example, we use all of them to calculate a single science grade for 7<sup>th</sup> and a single science grade for 8<sup>th</sup>. We average these for a single science grade and finally average the four core subjects for a GPA.

Because schools report grades in different ways, we convert all original scores to a common scale 0-4.0 before averaging them.

Schools using standards-based report cards typically provide us with an additional score and rubric regarding quality of work for each subject.

### 3. Why do you start the application process so early?

We want to offer students the opportunity to enroll at UHS in January-February of their 8<sup>th</sup> grade year. If they do not qualify, they still have time to explore other options including applying for TUSD magnet programs and open enrollment.

### 4. Do you give students who do not qualify for UHS a second chance?

Students cannot retest or submit revised grades for a given academic year. However, students can re-apply for admission the following year. See the requirements for transfers to UHS on the website main page.

#### 5. What documents do homeschooled students need to submit?

Homeschooled students should submit grades and a description of their curriculum or course of study. If they do not have grades, they need to submit a portfolio of their work for evaluation by UHS staff. They also need to take the CogAT and may be asked to take the ACT Tessera self-assessment.

#### 6. How and when do I know if I am accepted at UHS?

All official notifications are mailed. See the Important Dates document for a timeline for the current application process.
